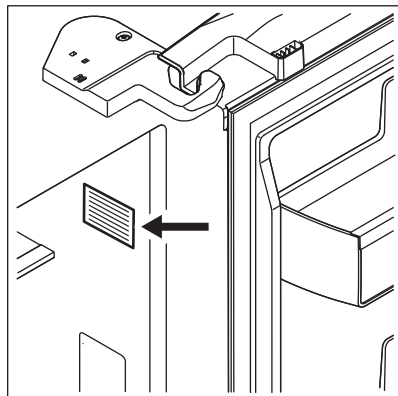

**Child safety**

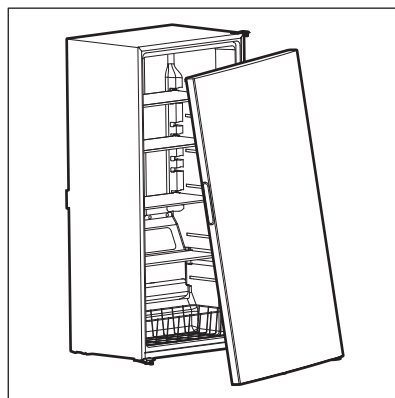

freezer, follow the instructions below to help prevent accidents.

We strongly encourage responsible appliance recycling/disposal methods. Check with your utility company or visit [www.energystar.gov/](http://www.energystar.gov/) recycle for more information on recycling your old refrigerator.

**Before you throw away your old refrigerator/freezer:**

- Remove doors.
- Leave shelves in place so children may not easily climb inside.
- Have it removed by a qualified service technician.

**IMPORTANT****CFC/HCFC Disposal**

Your old refrigerator may have a cooling system that used CFCs or HCFCs (chlorofluorocarbons or hydrochlorofluorocarbons). CFCs and HCFCs are believed to harm stratospheric ozone if released to the atmosphere. Other refrigerants may also cause harm to the environment if released to the atmosphere.

If you are throwing away your old refrigerator, make sure the refrigerant is removed for proper disposal by a qualified technician. If you intentionally release refrigerant, you may be subject to fines and imprisonment under provisions of environmental legislation.

## SAFETY IMPORTANT INFORMATION

### Electrical information



#### IMPORTANT

Turning on the appliance controls to OFF will disable the appliance cooling system but does not disconnect the power to the light bulb and other electrical components. To turn off power to the appliance you must unplug the power cord from the electrical outlet.

- The appliance must be plugged into its own dedicated 115 Volt, 60 Hz., 15 Amp, AC only electrical outlet. The power cord of the appliance is equipped with a three-prong grounding plug for your protection against electrical shock hazards. It must be plugged directly into a properly grounded three-prong receptacle. The receptacle must be installed in accordance with local codes and ordinances. Consult a qualified electrician. Avoid connecting the appliance to a Ground Fault Interrupter (GFI) circuit. Do not use an extension cord or adapter plug.
- If the power cord is damaged, it should be replaced by an authorized service technician to prevent any risk.
- Never unplug the appliance by pulling on the power cord. Always grip the plug firmly, and pull straight out from the receptacle to prevent damaging the power cord.
- Unplug the appliance before cleaning and before replacing the AC LED light bulb to avoid electrical shock. Use only a 5-watt or less AC LED light bulb.
- Performance may be affected if the voltage varies by 10% or more. Operating the appliance with insufficient power can damage the compressor. Such damage is not covered under your warranty.
- Do not plug the unit into an electrical outlet controlled by a wall switch or pull cord to prevent the appliance from being turned off accidentally.



#### WARNING!

Do not, under any circumstances, cut, remove, or bypass the grounding prong (A). Always use the power cord with a three-prong grounded plug and grounding type wall receptacle.



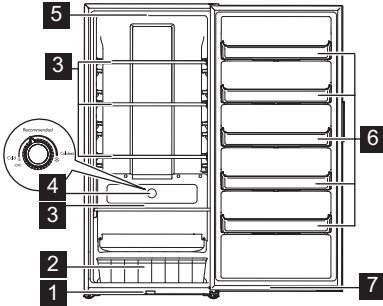

## INSTALLATION

This User Manual provides general installation and operating instructions for your model. We recommend using a service or kitchen contracting professional to install your appliance. Use the appliance only as instructed in this User Manual. Before starting the appliance, follow these important first steps.

### ✓ Installation Checklist

#### Doors

- Door seals completely the cabinet on all sides
- Freezer door is level from side to side across the top

#### Leveling

- Appliance is level side-to-side and tilted 1/4" (6 mm) front-to-back
- Cabinet is setting solid on all corners
- Anti-tip bracket set in front on both sides

#### Electrical Power

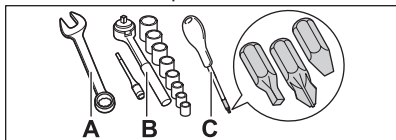
- House power is turned on
- Appliance is plugged in

#### Final Checks

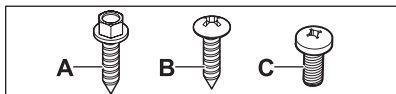
- Shipping material is removed

### Tools necessary

These tools are necessary at different stages of the installation process:



- A. 5/16" Fixed Wrench
- B. Socket Wrench
- C. Screwdriver: Phillips™ Head or #2 Square Drive Head and Flat Head



#### Components Provided

- A. Hinge Screw 5/16" (8 mm)
- B. Door Closer #2 Phillips™
- C. Pan Head Quadrex MSX12

### Cleaning the appliance



#### IMPORTANT

Remove tape and glue residue from surfaces before turning the appliance on. Rub a small amount of liquid dish soap over the adhesive with your fingers. Rinse with warm water and dry with a soft cloth.

Do not use sharp instruments, rubbing alcohol, flammable fluids, or abrasive cleaners to remove tape or glue. These products can damage the surface of the appliance.

After you remove all of the package materials, clean the inside of the appliance before using it. Refer to Care and Cleaning.

See important information about cleaning glass shelves and covers in the Storage Features section.

### Location

- Choose a place that is near a grounded, non-GFCI, electrical outlet. Do not use an extension cord or an adapter plug.
- If possible, place the appliance out of direct sunlight and away from the range, dishwasher, or other heat sources.
- The appliance must be installed on a floor that is level and strong enough to support a fully loaded appliance.



#### WARNING!

This appliance is intended for use in residential household and similar interior applications such as:

- Kitchen / kitchenette
- Pantry room
- Basement
- Enclosed garage
- Other interior residential type environments



#### CAUTION!

Do not install the appliance where the temperature will drop below 0°F (-18°C) or rise above 110 °F (43 °C). The compressor will not be able to maintain proper temperatures inside the appliance.



#### NOTE

Do not block the toe grille on the lower front of the appliance. Sufficient air circulation is essential for the proper operation of the appliance.

**WARNING!**

Allow the following clearances for ease of installation, proper air circulation, and plumbing and electrical connections:

- Sides and top 3/8" (9.5 mm)
- Back 1" (25.4 mm)

**NOTE**

If you place the appliance with the door hinge side against a wall, you may have to allow additional space so the door can be open wider.

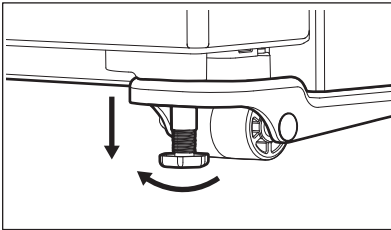
### Cabinet leveling and door alignment

Guidelines for final positioning of appliance:

- All 4 corners of the cabinet must rest firmly on the floor.
- The cabinet should be level at the front and rear.
- The door should be level.

### Setting the anti-tip brackets

The anti-tip brackets are located on the lower front corners of the cabinet. Lower the anti-tip brackets on each side clockwise until they contact the floor. Do not raise the cabinet.

**NOTE**

The anti-tip bracket must be installed according to the instructions in the User Manual. Failure to do so may result in injury.

## Door Removal and Reversal

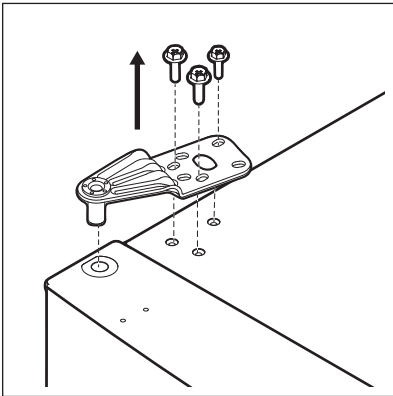
**NOTE**

The direction in which the appliance doors open (door swing) can be reversed, from left to right or right to left, by moving the door hinges from one side to the other. A qualified person should reverse the door swing.

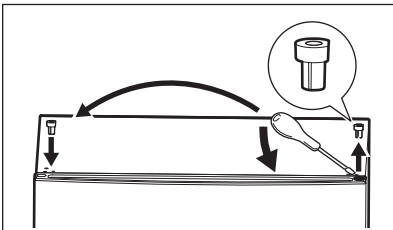
**IMPORTANT**

Before you begin, turn the appliance temperature control to OFF and remove the electrical power cord from the wall outlet. Remove any food from door shelves.

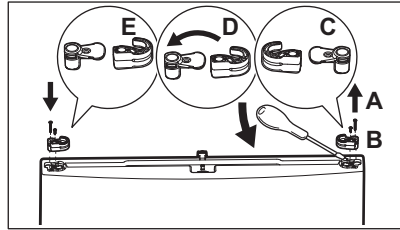
1. Unplug the appliance.
2. Remove the 3 screws from the top hinge using a Phillips™ screwdriver or 5/16" wrench. Set the hinge and screws aside.



3. Gently pry the hinge bearing out from the top of the freezer door with a flathead screwdriver.



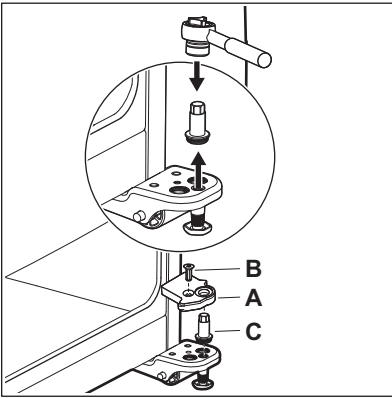
4. Install the hinge bearing on the opposite side of the door. Remove the door from the unit by lifting the door up.
  - A. Flip the door over to access the bottom. Using a Phillips™ screwdriver remove the screws from the hinge bearing and the door closer.
  - B. Using a flat head screwdriver, gently pry the closer/bearing assembly out of the door.
  - C. Separate the door closer and hinge bearing.
  - D. Flip the door closer over 180° and reinstall the closer onto the hinge bearing.
  - E. Using a Phillips™ screwdriver, attach the door closer/bearing assembly to the opposite side of the door

**NOTE**

Place the door on a padded surface to prevent damage.

5. Using a Phillips™ screwdriver, remove the screw from the door stop.
6. Using a flat head screwdriver, gently pry the door stop off the bottom hinge pin.

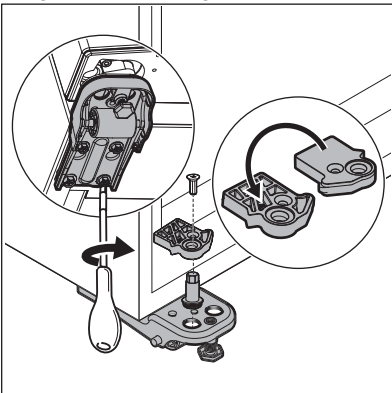
- Using a ratchet with a 12 mm socket, remove the bottom hinge pin.



- A. Door stop screw
- B. Door stop
- C. Bottom hinge pin

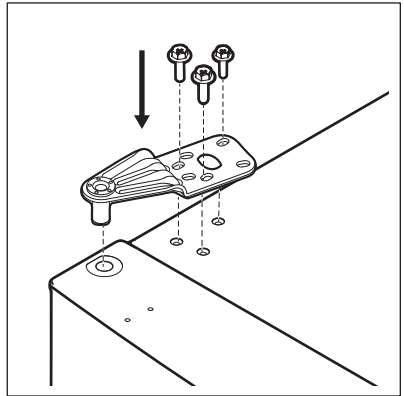
- Reinstall the hinge pin into the outer hole and follow the procedure:
  - Tighten with a ratchet and a 12 mm socket.
  - Flip door stop over 180°.
  - Reinstall onto the opposite hinge over the hinge pin.

With the assistance of another person, tilt the appliance back, to have access to the bottom hinge. Loosen the hinge screws slightly, flip the door stopper, and place it on top of the bottom hinge, making adjustments until the stopper is flush against the unit. Tighten all screws.



- D. Secure the door stop with a screw.

- Slide the door onto the bottom hinge pin at 90° to the freezer cabinet and close the door.
- Using a Phillips™ screwdriver or a 5/16" wrench, secure the top hinge using 3 5/16" screws.



- Plug the freezer power cord back into the electrical outlet, and turn the freezer temperature control to the Recommended setting.

### Cool down period

To ensure safe food storage, allow the appliance to operate with the doors closed for at least 8 hours before loading it with food.

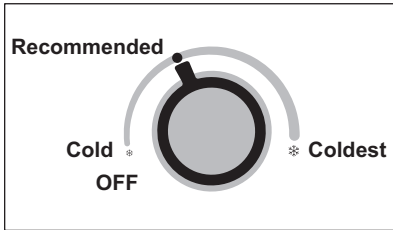


#### NOTE

When first turning the appliance on, adjust the control to Recommended. After 24 hours, adjust the controls as needed.

### Appliance Control

#### Freezer Control



#### Temperature Adjustment



#### NOTE

Adjusting the temperature control to OFF turns off the compressor and prevents the refrigerator from cooling, but does not disconnect the power to the light bulb and other electrical components. To turn off power to your refrigerator, you must unplug the power cord from the wall outlet.

Adjust the temperature gradually: adjust the knobs in small increments, allowing the temperature to stabilize.

- For colder temperatures, adjust the control toward Coldest.
  - For warmer temperatures, adjust the control toward Cold.

## Door Storage

Door bins, shelves, and racks conveniently store jars, bottles, and cans. You can quickly select frequently used items.

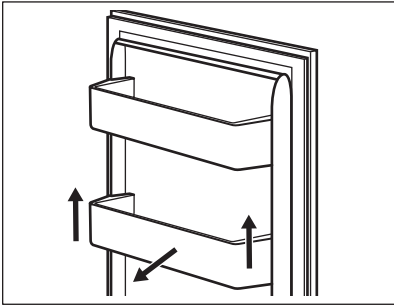
## Door Bins

To remove the door bin:

1. Lift up the bin.
2. Pull it straight out.

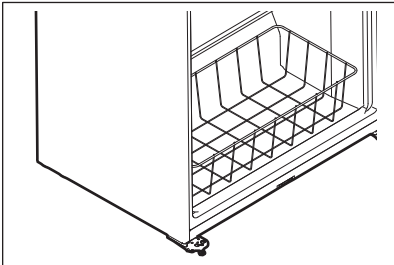
To install the door bin:

1. Push the bin back and down into the locking tabs.
2. The bin sides will lock into the tabs.



## Freezer Basket

The freezer basket is ideal for large items or items that do not store well on the shelves.



### IMPORTANT

Do not fill the basket above the top edge, this will impact the air flow performance.

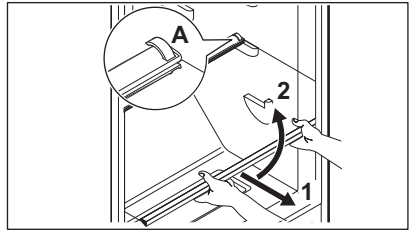
## Shelf adjustment

Adjust the shelves to suit individual needs. Before adjusting the shelves, remove all food.

To adjust shelves, slide the shelf by moving it forward and lifting it upward.

To replace shelves, insert the rear of the shelf into any pair of shelf rails and carefully push

the shelf back into position, making sure the shelf clips (A) go in the notch in the liner.

### CAUTION!

When reinstalling the shelf, ensure the shelf clip is attached to the liner and holds it in place.



### CAUTION!

Do not clean glass shelves or covers with warm water when they are cold. Shelves and covers may break if exposed to sudden temperature changes or impact, such as bumping. Tempered glass is designed to shatter into many small, pebble-size pieces. This is normal. Glass shelves and covers are heavy. Use both hands when removing them to avoid dropping.



### NOTE

To avoid personal injury or property damage, handle tempered glass shelves carefully. Shelves may break suddenly if nicked, scratched, or exposed to sudden temperature change.

# 12 CARE AND CLEANING

## Protecting your investment

Keeping your appliance clean maintains its appearance and prevents odor build-up. Wipe up any spills immediately and clean the freezer and fresh food compartments at least twice a year. When cleaning, take the following precautions:

- Never use chloride or cleaners with bleach to clean stainless steel.
- Do not wash any removable parts in a dishwasher.
- Always unplug the electrical power cord from the wall outlet before cleaning.
- Do not remove the serial plate. Removal of your serial plate voids your warranty.
- Remove adhesive labels by hand. Do not use razor blades or other sharp instruments which can scratch the appliance surface.

Do not use abrasive cleaners such as window sprays, scouring cleansers, brushes, flammable fluids, cleaning waxes, concentrated detergents, bleaches or cleansers containing petroleum products on plastic parts, interior doors, gaskets or cabinet liners. Do not use paper towels, metallic scouring pads, or other abrasive cleaning materials or strong alkaline solutions.

Refer to the guide below for more details on caring and cleaning specific areas of your appliance.



### NOTE

If you set your temperature controls to turn off cooling, power to lights and other electrical components will continue until you unplug the power cord from the wall outlet.



### CAUTION!

Pull the appliance straight out to move it. Shifting it from side to side may damage flooring.



### CAUTION!

Damp objects stick to cold metal surfaces. Do not touch refrigerated surfaces with wet or damp hands.

Some upright freezers are frost-free and defrost automatically, but should be cleaned occasionally.

## Care & Cleaning Tips

Part	What to use	Tips and precautions
Interior and door liners	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Soap and water</li><li>• Baking soda and water</li></ul>	Use 2 tablespoons of baking soda in 1 quart of warm water. Be sure to wring excess water out of sponge or cloth before cleaning around controls, light bulb or any electrical part.
Door gaskets	Soap and water	Wipe gaskets with a clean soft cloth.
Glass shelves	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Soap and water</li><li>• Glass cleaner</li><li>• Mild liquid sprays</li></ul>	Allow glass to warm to room temperature before immersing in warm water.
Exterior	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Soap and water</li></ul>	Never use chloride or cleaners with bleach to clean stainless steel. Always clean, wipe and dry with the grain to prevent scratching. Wash the rest of the cabinet with warm water and mild liquid detergent. Rinse well, and wipe dry with a clean soft cloth.
Replacing LED bulbs	<ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Unplug the appliance.</li><li>2. Wear gloves.</li><li>3. Replace old bulb.</li><li>4. Replace light cover.</li><li>5. Plug in the appliance.</li></ol>	<b>Caution:</b> Wear gloves when replacing LED light bulbs to avoid getting cut. Use same wattage when replacing bulb. Use only a 5-watt or less AC LED light bulb.

## Common occurrences

---

Freezer does not run.

- Ensure the plug is tightly pushed into an electrical outlet.
- Check/replace the fuse with a 15amp time-delay fuse. Reset the circuit breaker.
- The freezer control is turned to OFF.
- Appliance may be in defrost cycle. Wait 20 minutes and check again.

---

The freezer temperature is unsatisfactory.

Check freezer temperatures and adjust the temperature control as needed.

---

Freezer temperature is warmer than preferred.

Set the freezer control to a colder setting until the temperature is satisfactory. Allow 24 hours for the temperature to stabilize.

---

The appliance is noisy or vibrates.

- The cabinet is not level.
- Floor is weak.
- Adjust the anti-tip bracket. Refer to Setting the anti-tip brackets in Installation.

---

Odors in the appliance.

- The interior needs to be cleaned.
- Cover or wrap the foods that produce odors.

---

Cabinet light is not working.

- Replace with only a 5Watt or less AC LED light bulb.
  - Ensure the plug is tightly pushed into an electrical outlet.

# 14 LIMITED WARRANTY

---

Your appliance is covered by a one year limited warranty. For one year from your date of delivery, Electrolux will pay all costs for repairing or replacing any parts of this appliance that prove to be defective in materials or workmanship when such appliance is installed, used and maintained in accordance with the provided instructions.

In addition to warranty shown above, ask your dealer about Crosley Extended Limited Warranty that comes to you at no extra charge for the 2nd through 10th years.

## Exclusions

This warranty does not cover the following:

1. Products with original serial numbers that have been removed, altered or cannot be readily determined.
2. Product that has been transferred from its original owner to another party or removed outside the USA or Canada.
3. Rust on the interior or exterior of the unit.
4. Products purchased "as-is" are not covered by this warranty.
5. Food loss due to any refrigerator or freezer failures.
6. Products used in a commercial setting.
7. Service calls which do not involve malfunction or defects in materials or workmanship, or for appliances not in ordinary household use or used other than in accordance with the provided instructions.
8. Service calls to correct the installation of your appliance or to instruct you how to use your appliance.
9. Expenses for making the appliance accessible for servicing, such as removal of trim, cupboards, shelves, etc., which are not a part of the appliance when it is shipped from the factory.
10. Service calls to repair or replace appliance light bulbs, air filters, water filters, other consumables, or knobs, handles, or other cosmetic parts.
11. Surcharges including, but not limited to, any after hour, weekend, or holiday service calls, tolls, ferry trip charges, or mileage expense for service calls to remote areas, including the state of Alaska.
12. Damages to the finish of appliance or home incurred during transportation or installation, including but not limited to floors, cabinets, walls, etc.
